- A well structured process for effective curriculum delivery has been evolved by the college under which classes are started from the very first day of the session. For the first three days, students are briefed about the institution, its Vision and Mission and also about other important academic systems such as CBCS holding of regular classes, weightage of attendance and various types of scholarships available in the college.
- The General Time Table for UG classes is prepared by the Time Table Committee Time Table for PG classes is prepared by the respective Heads of Departments in consultation with other teachers of the Department. The Time Table is uploaded on the college web site on face book, displayed on Department and College Notice boards. Teachers are allocated periods as per UGC norms.
- Advanced learners are motivated to read more books, while slow learners are provided special help in the form of comparatively easier books and books from teacher's personal collection.
- Classes are held regularly and all efforts are made to cover 100% syllabus.
- Special lectures are also arranged for further enriching the curriculum.

2.5.2 Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The following reforms have been initiated at college level on continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE):

- In the very beginning of the semester, students are apprised about CIE that they would be regularly evaluated throughout the semester.
- Under CIE, student's performance is monitored and evaluated formally as well as informally. Formal evaluation is done through Sessional tests and Assignments (30 Marks out of 100 at UG level 15 for test and 15 marks for assignment) and 40 Marks out of 100 at PG level. There is one Internal/Sessional Test at UG level: at PG level, there are two Sessional Tests of 20 Marks each. Besides this formal assignment and evaluation, students are also evaluated informally on the basis of their active participation in the teaching learning process, their regularity and punctuality, their performance in group discussions / class room quizzes etc.
- CCTVs are installed in examination rooms. This ensures fair examination system.
- Transparency is maintained in declaring the results of Sessional Tests. Students are informed about their Marks.
- Detailed feedback is provided to them about their performance. Suggestions are also provided for improvement.
- Marks obtained by students in Sessional Tests are uploaded on HNBG University Award Sheets on line.

2.5.3 Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

- H.N.B. Garhwal University (A Central University) is the affiliating University of the college. The University prepares the Academic Calendar each year. The college adheres to this calendar (with slight modifications at college level order to adjust/incorporate dates of Sessional Tests and other activities like Sports etc.)
- The Academic Calendar is chalked out before the beginning of each Academic Session and it is included in the college prospectus.
- The modalities of Academic Calendar are discussed and finalised through IQAC.

The college ensures optimal allocation and utilization of the available financial recourses for maintenance and upkeep of different facilities by holding regular meetings of various committees constituted for this purpose and using the grants received the college as per the requirements in the interest of students.

Laboratory: Record of maintenance account is maintained by lab technicians and supervised by HODs of the concerned departments. Other measures to maintain laboratories are as follows:

• The calibration, repairing and maintenance of sophisticated lab equipments are done by the technicians of related owner enterprises.

- The microscopes used for biological and geological experiments are annually cleaned and maintained by the concerned departments and record of maintenance is maintained by lab technicians and supervised by HODs of the concerned departments.
- There is systematic disposal of waste of all types such as bio-degradable chemical/chemical and e-waste as per the regulation of Pollution Control Board.

Library: The requirement and list of books is taken from the concerned departments and HoDs are involved in the process. The finalized list of required books is duly approved and signed by the Principal.

- Every year in the beginning of session, students are motivated to register themselves in library to use INFLIBNET. During 2017-18 sessions the number of INFLIBNET users was 943.
- The Library has special facility for visually challenged students by setting up two special computers for them.
- Suggestion box is installed inside the reading room to take users feedback. Their continuous feedback helps a lot in introducing new ideas regarding library enrichment.
- To ensure return of books, 'no dues' from the library is mandatory for students before appearing in exam.
- The proper account of visitors (students and staff) on daily basis is maintained.
- Other issues such as weeding out of old titles, schedule of issue/ return of books etc are chalked out / resolved by the library committee.

Sports: Regarding the maintenance of indoor Badminton/ Volley Ball court/ Basket Ball court / TT Courts /Gym on the college sports in charge consult coaches. In their guidance accommodates are arranged. During the session 2017-18 college won the cricket intercollegiate championship. College students also won prizes in Chess, Boxing, Football, Basket Ball (W & M), Table Tennis, 400 meters Race, 100 meters race in University level sports.

Computers: Centralized computer laboratory established by UGC funds and more funds are used to maintain computers in the college. Computer maintenance through AMC is done regularly and non-repairable systems are disposed off.

Classrooms-The college has a building committee for maintenance and upkeep of infrastructure. At the departmental level, HoDs submit their requirements to the Principal regarding classroom furniture and other. The college development fund is utilized for maintenance and minor repair of furniture and other electrical equipments.

- With the help of the two full time sweepers cleanliness of class rooms is maintained. They are well equipped with modern tools of cleaning such as mops, gloves and vacuum cleaner.
- A complaint register is maintained in office in which students as well as faculty can register their problems which are resolved within a set time frame.
- Students are sensitized regarding cleanliness and motivated for energy conservation by careful use of electricity in classrooms.
- SGRR College/ SGRR Education Mission has its own workshop where furniture repair is done without any charges.

There are technicians, masons, plumbers, carpenters deputed by management who ensure the maintenance of classrooms and related infrastructure.

The financial resources of the college are managed in a very effective and efficient manner. Complete

computerization of accounts. Double entry system is followed to maintain the accounts of the college.

Three types of accounts are created mainly:

- (a) Receipts and payment account.
- (b) Income and expenditure account.
- (c) Balance Sheet account.

Each and every transaction is supported by the vouchers. All the collections are deposited in the bank and all expenditure, recurring and non –recurring are incurred through cheques. Only a duly authorized person can operate the bank. For effective check on the accounts, the two tier system is followed; the internal and external audit is done regularly.

The internal accounts are maintained by the accountant. It is looked after by Office Superintendent and headed by the Management and Principal. The internal audit is done by Patet and Company (Subhash Road, Dehradun).

The external audit is done by Director Of Higher Education (Government of Uttarakhand). Our external auditor is Mr. Ritesh Kumar CA (DSM and Sons, 74 National Road Dehra Dun).

The institution is liberal, yet follows the strategy of restraint as far as expenditure is concerned. Proper procedure for purchasing is adopted .Purchase committee is constituted for this purpose. Quotations are called for and prices are compared .Priority is given to DGS&D (Director General Demand and Supply) purchases. The regular audit of the budget also exercises check on the expenditure.

Internal audit of the departments are carried out annually. Separate accounts are maintained for all the grants so as to use the financial resources efficiently and effectively. Last audit of CAG held on dated 19/12/2015 to 28/12/2015.

- 3. The college has a very spacious (48.6 acres) campus which has been put to good use. There are two basket ball and Volley Ball Courts, one badminton court, one Cricket Net practice court, one football field and racing track. Students actively make use of these facilities. The college also has a fruit orchard, a medicinal plants

farm and one poly house. Organic farming is done in these Agricultural fields.

4. The college is located within half Kilometer radius of Railway station; it is very convenient for those students who come to the college from nearby towns connected with rail route. Such students have been issued OST.

Disadvantage:

Since the college is located in the outskirts of Dehradun City. Local Transport connectivity is a bit of a problem. Frequency of local bus transport is quite low on this rout.
